Instructions for Loading eBooks on the Nook or Kindle

Kindle Transferring Your Files by USB

Just click on the picture of the book to download the eBook from the website and then click the save button. Select your Desktop as the saved location. If you use a micro-usb cable and connect it to your computer, you can transfer files to and from your Kindle just like it was an external hard drive. Look in My Computer and you'll find the Kindle just like other drives. Place any .mobi files in the Books folder, and place .pdf and other formats in the Documents folder. Once you've added your files, you may need to restart the Kindle to get it to recognize your new books.

Nook Transferring Your Files by USB

Download the eBook from the website by just clicking on the picture of the book and then click the save button. Select your Desktop as the saved location. Once you have the book downloaded to your computer, connect your Nook using the provided USB cable. Your Nook will show up as an external drive in My Computer. Just transfer it just like you would any other file. It does need to go into a specific folder on the Nook. But you might want to put it with the other epub ebooks. Common locations on the Nook are either the Digital Editions folder or My Documents or on an SD card under \My Files\Books.
